The Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Society invites you to attend the 30<sup>th</sup> Annual Rawlings Conference in Daytona Beach, Florida. The conference will be held at the Daytona Beach Resort and Conference Center. The Daytona Beach Resort and Conference Center is located at 2700 N. Atlantic Avenue, Daytona Beach, FL 32118.
